This regatta would be an excellent opportunity for high school students interested with visiting New England Colleges.

## **Notice of Race**

2011 Lawrence A. White Trophy, USCGA Fall High School Invitational Regatta 15-16 October, 2011  
U.S. Coast Guard Academy, New London, CT

1. Rules: This regatta will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing, The Prescriptions of US Sailing, The Procedural Rules for Interscholastic Competition and The Sailing Instructions.
2. Format: Two divisions (two skippers, two crews, plus substitutes) per school; twenty-two teams; a single round-robin will be attempted and a boat rotation will be posted prior to the competitors meeting.
3. Boats: 420s and FJs as supplied by the U.S. Coast Guard Academy. An attempt will be made, at the discretion of the Host, to switch Divisions and Fleets at or approximately half way through the regatta. In the event of bad weather and at the discretion of the Host, both divisions may be sailed in C420s.
4. Report Time: 0830 on Saturday October 15, 2011. Competitors meeting NLT 0930.
5. Last Race: No race will start after 1530 on Sunday October 16, 2011
6. Housing and Meals: Will be the responsibility of each team. Please bring lunch materials with you since teams will not leave the Academy grounds during racing hours.
7. Parking: Team vehicles may be parked on Eagle Drive along the waterfront. Each vehicle may be required to show license and registration. In addition, all competitors should be prepared to show a photo ID to the security officer at the front gate.
8. Eligibility: ISSA Member Teams must meet the eligibility requirements of the Inter-Scholastic Sailing Association.

9. Berths: Teams apply for berths to the organizers. Berths will be filled by the organizers according to the following District allocation: **MASSA – 5; MWISA – 2; NESSA – 5; NWISA – 1; PCISA – 1; SAISA – 2; SEISA – 1; USCGA Reserved - 5.** Registration will be set on **September 16, 2011**; any team that registers after that date will be placed on the waitlist by date of registration. In the event that more schools apply for a District than are allocated for that District, then a lottery will be held on September 16, 2011 for that District to determine which school(s) will represent that District. Schools not selected from the lottery will be placed on the waitlist by date of registration. District berths not filled by September 16, 2011 will be filled from the list of teams on the waitlist. If there are more schools on the waitlist than available slots, a lottery will be conducted on September 16, 2011 to determine which school(s) will attend. In the event that a selected school withdraws after September 17, 2011, that berth will be filled from the waitlist by district, by date of registration, then from general waitlist by date of registration.

10. Application for Berths and Registration: **Only official team representatives (coaches or advisor) as posted on the ISSA Team Information Web Page can register a team.** Apply to : James Perkins, via e-mail at james.perkins.01@snet.net. Teams will be notified promptly of their selection.
